

Superfast Broadband for the Roseland

In keeping with their pledge of enabling upwards of 80% of homes in Cornwall with fibre based Superfast Broadband (SFB), SFBCornwall (SFBC) will be aiming to fulfil that target for the Roseland at least. It seems from our recent meeting with the SFB Teams that not everyone on the Roseland will be able to get this new technology, However, if you live either in Rosevine, Trewithian and Curgurrel, Ruan Laniorne, or on, or very close to, the road leading through Philleigh towards Veryan from King Harry, you have a chance of an extension of SFB being enabled to these areas.

However, this 'extension' will only be considered if a large percentage of residents in these areas express an interest to have SFB and pledge their support for enablement of this extension.

There are two ways you should do this:

1. Register your interest on the Superfast Cornwall website. Go to: **www.superfastcornwall.org/keep-me-in-the-loop.html** and sign up. This way they will be able to track just how many people registered with phone lines might be interested in Superfast Broadband.
2. Register your property with Roseland Online (who, Along with Martin Edwards) are heading up this initiative for the Roseland. Just Email me, **mark@roseland-online.co.uk** with your name, full address and phone number.

None of the above will commit you to buying or upgrading to a SFB service, but it will give BT Openreach and the SFBC team a good idea of those who might be interested if BT go to the expense of putting it in.

This is a one-off, one time opportunity to be included into the delivery of new SFB technology being delivered to Rural areas in Cornwall which is what the SFBC, Cornwall Council and BT have funding for. If missed, it might be many years before this opportunity arises again, so we cannot stress the importance of action now.

The more who know, the better chance you have of having a Philleigh and Rosevine area rollout of SFB by June 2013.
